Transformation Information Session

The speakers, Andrew Norrie (IEF) and Sean Pettis (NICIE) presented a clear overview of the process and were happy to answer any queries. The session will be repeated on the Zoom platform on Wednesday 23rd February at 7.30p.m. for those who were unable to secure a place. (Being mindful of the current health situation it was impossible to encourage a full audience, yet it is important that all parents have an opportunity to hear the messages and have their questions answered.) In addition, Andrew and a colleague will facilitate a Drop-in session on Tuesday 8th March from 1.30 – 3.30p.m. at the school whereby anyone can call in and discuss questions that may have come up as a result of meetings or general discussion.

NEXT STEP – THE BALLOT From 21st February each person with parental responsibility – mother, father, step-parent, foster carer, can expect a letter from CIVICA (consultancy company who will facilitate our *impartial* ballot) with a question regarding transformation. We will hope for a YES vote, but everyone is entitled to their choice. To enable us move on with the process we will need as many people as possible to use their vote and 50% +1 of these votes need to be in favour of transformation for us to proceed. It is VITAL that both parents/step-parent/carer return the vote by post to CIVICA. You can expect reminders!!
