Traffic Management Campaign

We are really delighted by the coverage in the Strabane Chronicle and Strabane Weekly News of our meeting with six of our local election candidates on Wednesday 17th April. The good news is that some things will happen in the near future to improve safety at the drop-off and pick-up times.

On Wednesday afternoon of last week, a representative of Roads Service NI and an officer from Community Policing met with Niamh Greenstreet, Conor McClintock and Keelin McCrea to hear at first-hand the school's concerns. While some of the ideas suggested are not possible due to our school's location the following will happen as soon as can be arranged, possibly before the end of this school year.

So look out for:

A raised platform across the school gates to slow traffic around the corners;

Guardrails and double yellow lines around the corners;

Repainting of all road markings and signage.

Meanwhile the Board of Governors continue to lobby the Dept. of Education for a longer lasting solution to this traffic problem using the extensive grounds at the front of the school.

However, both visitors commented that it remains a responsibility on drivers to be fully vigilant and also on adults collecting children to pay attention to road safety and also to measures taken to ensure safety for all.
